THE SACRED TRIDUUM

Christ redeemed us all and gave perfect glory to God principally through his paschal mystery: "dying he destroyed our death and rising he restored our life."

Therefore the Sacred Triduum of the Passion and Resurrection of Christ is the culmination of the entire liturgical year. The Triduum begins on Maundy Thursday with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, reaches its high point in the Easter Vigil, and closes with evening prayer on Easter Sunday.

On Good Friday we observe a day of fasting and abstinence and, if possible, on Holy Saturday until the Easter Vigil, the Easter fast is observed.

The Easter Vigil, during the holy night when Christ rose from the dead, is regarded by the Church as the most important liturgical celebration of the whole year. Keeping watch, the Church awaits Christ's resurrection and celebrates it in the sacraments. Accordingly, the entire celebration of this Vigil takes place after nightfall.

Święconka - Holy Saturday 12noon

Święconka or the blessing of the Easter baskets is a much loved Polish tradition. The baskets are traditionally lined with a white linen or lace napkin & decorated with sprigs of Easter evergreen. The contents are blessed & baskets sprinkled with holy water (*using a special Polish straw brush*).

Each of the foods in the baskets has a symbolic meaning:

- ✦ *eggs - symbolise life and Christ's resurrection*
- ✦ *bread - symbolic of Jesus*
- ✦ *lamb - represents Christ*
- ✦ *salt - represents purification*
- ✦ *horseradish - symbolic of the bitter sacrifice of Christ*
- ✦ *ham - symbolic of great joy and abundance*

The food is eaten on Saturday afternoon or Sunday morning.
