SAINTS OF THE WEEK

SAINT JOHN CHRYSOSTOM ...was given the name Chrysotom ('Golden Mouth') because of his excellent preaching & his many exhortations & catecheses. He was born in Antioch in 349, became a priest & was made Bishop of Constantinople in 397. As a result of his preaching he was twice exiled by the Imperial Court & died in exile in 407.

SAINTS CORNELIUS & CYPRIAN ... both lived in a time of great turbulence in the Church. They were in the forefront of the debate on reconciling those who had denied the faith under persecution. Together, Cornelius & Cyprian struck up a middle course & guided the Church through their writing & preaching, Cornelius died in exile in 253 & Cyprian was martyred in 258.
