REFLECTION

Today's feast is a celebration of the fact that Christ gave himself not only in self sacrifice on the Cross but also in the self giving of his very Body and Blood as food for us to eat and drink that brings us to eternal life. Today's Gospel makes the comparison between the manna given to God's people in the desert (see also the First Reading) and the Body and Blood of Christ - the former sustained only the earthly life of Israel, the latter sustains our eternal life.
